



In Search of the Ivory-billed Woodpecker

On February 11, 2004 while kayaking through Arkansas' Cache River National Wildlife Refuge, a resident observed the "extinct" ivory-billed woodpecker. Within a month, a search team was launched to search for the elusive bird by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, The Nature Conservancy and others. Then, on April 25, 2004 David Luneau, of the University of Arkansas, captured on video what he and other experts now believe to be an ivory-billed woodpecker.
